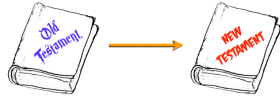

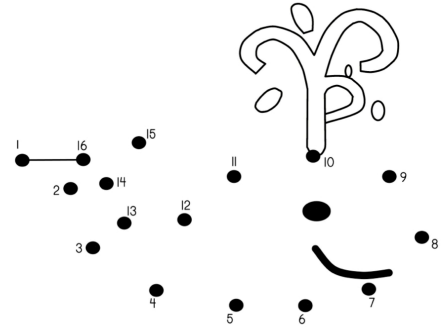

## CONNECT-THE-DOTS

**Instructions:** See if you can make the following Old and New Testament connections that are hidden in the Bible. \*Note: These are just *some* examples of Biblical typology. There are TONS more in the Bible! (SO COOL!!!!!!)



### ADAM & EVE (Genesis 2-3)

Old Testament	New Testament
Adam brings sin into the world	
Eve brings sin into the world	
Eve said "Yes" to the angel of darkness, the devil	
Eve comes out of Adam	
Takes place in the Garden of Eden	
Tree of Life brings about death	
Adam was naked and put on clothes because he was ashamed	

### JONAH AND THE WHALE (Book of Jonah)

Old Testament	New Testament
Jonah spent 3 days in the belly of the whale	
Jonah appears to be dead but survives	
Jonah saved many people through his preaching	

### THE ARK OF THE COVENANT (Book of Exodus)

Old Testament	New Testament
The Ark of the Covenant carried the words of God (the stone tablets with the 10 Commandments on them)	
The Ark of the Covenant carried the manna (bread) from Heaven to feed the people	

## ABRAHAM & ISAAC (Genesis 22)

Old Testament	New Testament
Abraham's only son = Isaac	
Isaac carries wood on his back	
Isaac carries the wood up a hill	
Isaac is bound and placed on the wood	
Isaac keeps asking, "Where is the lamb for the holocaust?" to which Abraham responds, "God himself will provide the lamb for the holocaust."	

## MOSES (The Pentateuch)

Old Testament	New Testament
As a baby Moses' life was threatened by a powerful ruler of the day (Pharaoh)	
Moses lived in Egypt for a time as a kid and eventually returned to Israel	
Moses fasted in the wilderness for 40 days	
Moses taught the people with the 10 Commandments on Mount Sinai	
Moses and the Israelites were tested with worshiping false gods, hunger in the desert, and putting God to the test (they failed the test)	
Moses eventually led the people to the Promised Land	

## THE EUCHARIST & THE PASSOVER LAMB (The Pentateuch, the Gospels)

Old Testament	New Testament
Sin entered the world through an act of eating	
The Israelites were saved when they received manna ("bread from Heaven")	
First-born Jews were saved when the blood of the lamb was smeared on the door frames	
Lambs are examined and, if found "without blemish", are sacrificed at Passover	
At the Passover meal they ate unleavened bread and the Passover Lamb
